ITEM 1. CALL TO ORDER. Mayor Agenbroad called the Springboro, Ohio City Council Work Session to order on Thursday, April 1, 2010 at 6:00 PM in Council Chambers at the Springboro Municipal Building, 320 W. Central Avenue, Springboro, Ohio.

ITEM 2. ATTENDANCE. Council: All present. **Staff:** Ms. Thompson, Mr. Schaeffer, Ms. Martin, and Police Chief Kruithoff were present. Assistant City Manager Chris Pozzuto was absent.

ITEM 3. LEGISLATIVE AGENDA. – Three legislative agenda items were reviewed for the April 1 Regular Meeting.

- 1) ORDINANCE: THIRD READING.** AN ORDINANCE LEVYING SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING OR REPAIRING CERTAIN SIDEWALKS AND DRIVEWAY APRONS IN THE CITY OF SPRINGBORO, COUNTY OF WARREN, OHIO AS DESCRIBED IN RESOLUTION NO. R-09-5. (2009 SIDEWALK/DRIVEWAY APRON PROGRAM- ASPHALT RESURFACING)

No discussion.

- 2) ORDINANCE: THIRD READING.** AN ORDINANCE LEVYING SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS FOR THE PURPOSE OF CONSTRUCTING OR REPAIRING CERTAIN SIDEWALKS AND DRIVEWAY APRONS IN THE CITY OF SPRINGBORO, COUNTY OF WARREN, OHIO AS DESCRIBED IN RESOLUTION NO. R-09-6. (2009 SIDEWALK/DRIVEWAY APRON PROGRAM- CONCRETE REPLACEMENT)

No discussion.

- 3) RESOLUTION:** A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO PREPARE AND SUBMIT APPLICATIONS FOR FEDERAL JOBS FOR MAIN STREET ACT OF 2010 FUNDS THROUGH THE MIAMI VALLEY REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION.

Ms. Thompson commented that this legislation is required to apply for the federal funding. Two projects, which must be shovel ready, have been identified by staff for funding. (1. Resurface Lytle Five Points Road from S.R. 741 to the east end of Settlers Walk Subdivision / 2. Resurface North Main St. from S.R. 73 to the North Corporation Limit)

ITEM 4. CITY MANAGER. – Issues/Reports.

Springboro Criterium Bike Race: Ms. Thompson referred to Jim Dennedy's proposal at the Work Session on March 18 to host a Criterium Bike Race in Springboro and request for the City's support of the event. Ms. Thompson reported that the Ohio Department of Transportation recently announced that E. Mill Street would be closed from April to December for roadway improvements and the bike race is proposed for June.

Council discussed several alternatives for the bike race due to the closing of E. Mill Street such as re-routing traffic to the west side of SR741 or re-routing the race to the west side of SR741, for example, down Mill Street past Factory Road to SR741 or incorporating Pioneer Boulevard into the race route. Ms. Thompson pointed out that re-routing traffic to the west of SR741 may be a nuisance to the residents of those subdivisions and when she spoke with Mr. Dennedy he indicated that they looked at alternative routes for the race and have determined there are no other options. Ms. Thompson also commented that people from outside of the community would not be familiar with the area enough to detour the race route to other roadways in the City like Pioneer.

Mr. Moore commented that one of the benefits or goals of the event is to showcase the downtown area and generate business. Ms. Thompson confirmed that Mr. Dennedy had mentioned that during his proposal.

Mr. LaDu commented that maybe next year would be a better year to host the event.

Mr. Moore asked if there would be any road projects in 2011. Ms. Thompson replied no, there would be no projects that would impact the proposed bike race route.

Ms. Belpulsi commented that the race route should be safe, as well.

Ms. Thompson confirmed that it is the City's position that the race cannot be accommodated this year as proposed due to the closing of E. Mill Street for construction.

Null Log House Repair Costs: Ms. Thompson referred to the memo prepared by Assistant City Manager Chris Pozzuto concerning the options and costs proposed by Architectural Reclamation (AR) to repair and preserve the Null Log House. Based on the two options presented by AR, staff recommends Option 2 at a cost not to exceed \$5,000 with a contribution from the Historical Society of an additional \$2,000 to open the second floor to tour groups.

Ms. Thompson will ask Historical Society representative Helen Sproat if the Society would agree to share the costs of the repairs under Option 2.

There were no objections to staff's recommendation of Option 2 at a cost not to exceed \$5,000.

Council Netbook Computers: Ms. Thompson distributed Netbooks to all Council Members. Ms. Thompson discussed some software options for the Netbooks to ensure Council Members are able to properly receive their agenda packets and other City related documents and e-mail. A subscription to Mobile Broadband was discussed as well as Adobe Acrobat editing software to review and edit pdf files. It was the general consensus that Mobile Broadband will be provided to Council Members upon request and that any additional software such as Adobe Acrobat Pro would be considered in the future if needed. Also, all Council Members provided or confirmed at least one individual e-mail address in addition to the address provided through the general e-mailbox.

Springboro's 200 Year Celebration: Ms. Thompson commented that Becky Hall contacted her regarding the City's 200th Anniversary in 2015. Ms. Thompson added that Mayor Agenbroad has been selected as chair of the committee that is being formed to coordinate the event. Ms. Thompson further commented that she recommended to Becky Hall that the committee consider fundraising activities over the next several years to prepare for the event instead of waiting until the last minute and requesting funding from the City. Ms. Thompson stated that she discussed fundraising opportunities at the Concerts in the Park and the Christmas in Historic Springboro Festival as well as golf outings as possibilities with Ms. Hall. Ms. Thompson further stated that Ms. Hall is looking for volunteers to serve on the committee.

Mayor Agenbroad asked if Ms. Hall considered applying for 501(c)(3) status. Ms. Thompson answered that she recommended that Ms. Hall talk to an attorney in regard to obtaining 501(c)(3) status.

Executive Session: Ms. Thompson requested an Executive Session, following the Work Session discussion, to discuss the purchase of property.

Ms. Lairson motioned to enter Executive Session under R.C.121.22(G), following the Work Session discussion, to discuss the purchase of property. Mr. Vomacka seconded the motion.

ITEM 5. CLERK OF COUNCIL. – Issues/Reports.

Calendar Update: The Bicycle & Pedestrian Advisory Committee will meet on Monday, April 12 and April 26 at 5:30 PM and 7:00 PM respectively in Council Chambers. The Business Appreciation Breakfast will be held on Thursday, April 22, 8-9:30 AM at Heatherwoode Club House. The 3rd U.S. District Office Hours will be held on Friday, April 30, 1:00-2:00 PM, in the Community Room.

Southwest Ohio Legislative Luncheon: The Southwest Ohio Legislative Luncheon sponsored by the Miami Valley Communications Council and Center for Local Government will be held on Friday, May 7, 11:00 AM-2:00 PM at Savannah Conference Center, West Chester. The luncheon serves as an opportunity for elected officials and management staff to gather together with state representatives from the southwest Ohio districts to discuss local government issues. Formal invitations to the luncheon will be sent in a few weeks.

April 15 Council Meeting: The next City Council Regular Meeting will begin with a Public Hearing for a request to rezone 1755 Sandy Court from (T)R-1 to R-2 followed by a National Bike Month Proclamation and a Bicycle & Pedestrian Advisory Committee progress report presented by Committee Chair Hans Landefeld. In addition, an Arbor Proclamation will be read.

City Board and Commission Handbook: Ms. Martin referred to the Final Draft of the City Board and Commission Handbook that was distributed with Council agenda packets for review. Ms. Martin asked if Council has any comments or revisions to the handbook. Several Council Members indicated that they would like to discuss the handbook in more detail. After a brief discussion, it was suggested that Council begin the May 6 Work Session at 5:00 PM to discuss the proposed City Board and Commission Handbook.

Mayor Agenbroad asked if there were any other staff reports.

Chief Kruithoff reported that the Police Department's public information sessions concerning the response plan to child endangerment situations in the community held on March 23 at Heatherwoode Club House were sparsely attended, but went well overall. Also, Chief Kruithoff commented that he spent most of the afternoon at Wright Brothers Airport due to the plane crash that occurred today.

Mayor Agenbroad asked if the people that were killed in the crash were Springboro residents. Chief Kruithoff commented that he believes they were Springboro residents.

ITEM 5. CITY COUNCIL. – Issues/Reports.

Mr. Vomacka – Mr. Vomacka commented that he did not have any committee reports, but would like to formally thank Chief Kruithoff for the informational meetings he held regarding the Police Department's response to child endangerment in the community. Also, Mr. Vomacka commented that Jan Vomacka did not receive an invitation to the Business Appreciation Breakfast. Mr. Vomacka asked if there might be other businesses missing from the invitation list, as well.

Ms. Thompson responded by stating that the invitation list is populated from utility billing and the Springboro Chamber membership, but she would follow up regarding Ms. Vomacka's invitation.

Ms. Lairson – Ms. Lairson reminded Council that the volunteers who helped with snow removal for residents in need over the winter were invited to the April 15 Council Regular Meeting for a short presentation in recognition of their service.

Mayor Agenbroad commented that he recently met with a group of people interested in volunteering through the Community Service Board and directed them to contact Ms. Thompson, Mr. Pozzuto, or Ms. Lairson.

Ms. Belpulsi – Ms. Belpulsi will announce the Planning Commission meeting, which was rescheduled to Wednesday, April 7 at 7:00 PM in Council Chambers. Also, Ms. Belpulsi commented that Chief Kruihoff presented a great program last Tuesday night regarding the Police Department's response to child endangerment in the community. She suggested that it would be a great program to produce on the government access cable TV channel.

Mr. Moore – Mr. Moore will present a Tree Authority report at tonight's Regular Meeting under Reports.

Mr. LaDu – Mr. LaDu commented that Council received a list of recommended applicants for the two newly created seats on the Community Service Board. Mr. LaDu suggested that Council discuss and proceed with those appointments tonight.

Of the three applicants recommended by the Community Service Board, Amy Blakeman and Mir Pasha were nominated to serve on the Community Service Board. There were no objections to the nominations.

Mayor Agenbroad stated that he would ask for a motion at tonight's Regular Meeting under Other Business to appoint Amy Blakeman and Mir Pasha to the Community Service Board for a term ending December 31, 2011.

Mr. Chmiel – No issues/reports.

Mayor Agenbroad – Mayor Agenbroad commented that he wanted to thank Water/Sewer Operations Manager Terry Morris for helping to resolve an issue this week. Also, Mayor Agenbroad commented that he met with a group of residents who were upset about people not cleaning up after their dogs in the park.

Ms. Thompson commented that there is a sign outlining park regulations including rules pertaining to dogs and a bag dispenser is available for dog owners to use to clean up after their dogs.

Mayor Agenbroad also commented that Council received a memo from Police Chief Kruihoff in regard to donating the metal detector no longer used by the Police Department and Mayor's Court to the Village of Waynesville. There were no objections to Chief Kruihoff's request to donate this equipment. Mayor Agenbroad stated that he would ask for a motion at tonight's Regular Meeting under Other Business to donate the metal detector to Waynesville.

Finally, Mayor Agenbroad stated that the Township has accepted the City's invitation to meet to discuss community issues and cooperative endeavors, but have left it up to the City to choose a date, time, and location for the meeting. It was suggested that Tuesday nights might be the most practical based on meeting schedules. Ms. Martin will poll Council with a list of possible meeting dates via e-mail.

At approximately 6:44 PM, Council entered Executive Session, under RC121.22(G), to discuss the purchase of property.

With no objections, City Council exited Executive Session at approximately 6:59 PM; whereby, no votes were taken.

ITEM 7. ADJOURNMENT. With no further discussion, Mayor Agenbroad adjourned the April 1, 2010 City Council Work Session at approximately 6:59 PM.

ITEM 1. CALL TO ORDER. Mayor Agenbroad called the Springboro, Ohio City Council Regular Meeting to order on Thursday, April 1, 2010 at 7:00 PM in Council Chambers at the Springboro Municipal Building, 320 W. Central Avenue, Springboro, Ohio.

ITEM 2. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE. Mayor Agenbroad led the Pledge of Allegiance.

ITEM 3. ROLL CALL. Agenbroad, Present; Belpulsi, Present; Chmiel, Present; LaDu, Present; Lairson, Present; Moore, Present; Vomacka, Present. Staff: Assistant City Manager Chris Pozzuto was absent.

ITEM 4. APPROVAL OF MINUTES: THE MINUTES OF THE CITY COUNCIL WORK SESSION AND REGULAR MEETING OF MARCH 18, 2010.

This resolution authorizes the City Manager to prepare and submit applications for Federal Jobs for Main Street Act of 2010 funds through the Miami Valley Regional Planning Commission. This resolution allows the City to apply for funding for two projects that were identified by the Public Works Director's Office as follows: 1) Resurfacing of Lytle Five Points Road from SR741 to the east end of Settlers Walk Subdivision and 2) Resurfacing N. Main Street from SR73 to the North Corporation Limit. If the City's application is successful, Federal Recovery Act funds would pay for 100% of the construction costs for the designated projects.

Ms. Belpulsi – Ms. Belpulsi reported that the Planning Commission Formal Meeting scheduled on March 31 was rescheduled and will be held on April 7 at 7:00 PM in Council Chambers. In addition, the Planning Commission will hold a Work Session on April 14 and a Formal Meeting on April 28 at 7:00 PM in Council Chambers.

Mr. Moore – Tree Authority – The Tree Authority met on March 23 and discussed the following items: The City has been awarded the Tree City USA Award and the Growth Award for 2009. The Tree Authority has received two Neighborhood Tree Grants, one for a fall planting of trees at the Villas at the Pointe of Settlers Walk and one for tree plantings in the Fieldstone area. Also, a contractor will begin treating the Ash Trees around the amphitheater as soon as the leaves begin to bud, which will protect the trees from the Emerald Ash Borer. In addition, approximately 40 more trees will be planted at Clearcreek Park and approximately 40 more trees at E. Milo Beck Park.

ITEM 9. FINAL COUNCIL AND MANAGER COMMENTS. Mr. Vomacka commented that on Tuesday, March 23, in response to some unfortunate incidences in town, Police Chief Kruihoff made two presentations for the community at a special meeting at the Heatherwoode Club House to explain how the City would respond to a threat to children in the community. Mr. Vomacka was impressed by Chief Kruihoff's presentation and the plan the City has in place to

respond to this type of event. The plan is a very structured, labored process, but the department can quickly bring in the Township, the County, the State, and the Federal Government, as resources to address and resolve a problem, and have access to many other resources and programs. Mr. Vomacka commented that he learned from Chief Kruithoff's presentation that if people perceive some kind of threat to children in their neighborhood the first thing they should do is contact the Springboro Police Department at 748-0611 or dial 911 immediately if it is an emergency. Contacting the Police Department should be the first response and the best response in this situation. Mr. Vomacka again thanked Chief Kruithoff for his presentations.

Mayor Agenbroad commented that Easter will be celebrated on Sunday and we have a lot to be thankful for in this country, but unfortunately today there was a tragedy; whereby, two Springboro residents were killed in a plane crash. Mayor Agenbroad asked for a moment of silence. (A moment of silence was observed.) Mayor Agenbroad thanked everyone for this moment of silent observance. Mayor Agenbroad asked that everyone please keep the families of the victims in their prayers.
